... that filling in ethnicity questions on forms can be uncomfortable and alienating for some people.

... when it comes to my own involvement with these types of forms, ensuring that the options/wording are as appropriate and inclusive as possible, but accepting there might not be a perfect solution (and question if it's even necessary to include!)

... that silence can be complicity.

... I will endeavour to speak up about race even when it feels difficult or I'm not sure how to do it.

... that sharing lived experiences can be just as triggering/traumatising as when they were first experienced.

... I will not assume that individuals will want to share their lived experiences, and if they do, I will be aware that this may have a triggering impact and [so] to be supportive in whatever way I can.

... that an ethnicity box was a straightforward exercise for many white people.

... I will encourage a conversation about the task and highlight my experiences.
