## <u>Special Introductory and PPI session on Breast and Cervical Health Literacy Research at St</u> George's, University of London -11 July 2023

At St George's University of London, we believe in the power of community engagement and collaboration to drive positive change in health outcomes. Recently, we had the privilege of hosting a Patient and Public Involvement (PPI) session with community leaders from Wandsworth Community Empowerment Network (WCEN), Tooting Community Kitchen, Muslim Women of Merton, Shree Ghanapathy Temple, and Little ARK. This session aimed to introduce our two studies 'Impact of the Know Your Lemons educator's programme on community champions' and 'Co-design cervical health literacy programme'. Professor Sanjeev Krishna, Dr. Yolanda Augustin, Dr. Nafeesa Mat Ali, and Hajnalka Kovacsevics from SGUL organised the session with Dr. Corrine Ellsworth-Beaumont from the Know Your Lemons foundation. The 'Impact of the Know Your Lemons educator' programme on community champions' is in collaboration with the Know Your Lemons foundation and is partly funded by the Public Engagement Seed Funds, and the 'Co-design cervical health literacy programme' is funded by the St George's Hospital Charity.
