Information Skills Training

Clinical and Research Enquiry Service (CARES)



The Library provides a free literature search service to support patient care, service evaluation and research. Additionally, we can set up an alert

OpenAthens Resources

With an NHS OpenAthens account you can access many more resources from your desktop. Register for an OpenAthens password at: <u>openathens.nice.org.uk</u>

When you register OpenAthens needs to verify that you are a member of NHS staff. To enable this, please register using an NHS computer and/or your NHS email.

Once you have your OpenAthens login details you will be able to access the following resources from anywhere via the internet:

E-books

Search Hunter, the Library catalogue at <u>huntersearch.sgul.ac.uk</u> to see the electronic books available to you.

To limit a search to e-books, choose the Online Resources filter. To open an e-book, click on View Online and then select NHS users log in here.

E-journals

The NHS have access to around 3000 full text electronic journals covering clinical medicine, nursing, psychology and healthcare management.

Use the NICE Journals A-Z search to check whether you have access to a specific title. Access this via our website or at: journals.nice.org.uk

Healthcare Databases

Databases enable you to search for articles by topic. Results from searches will show access options and, when available, give you a link to the full-text article.

Databases include: Medline, EMBASE, CINAHL, BNI, PsycINFO, AMED, EMCARE and HMIC. Search these at: <u>hdas.nice.org.uk</u>

The largest single repository of case reports online, a peer-reviewed collection of cases in all disciplines where healthcare professionals can easily find clinical information on common and rare conditions.

BMJ Best Practice

BMJ Best Practice is a point of care tool that gives healthcare professionals fast and easy access to the latest information when making diagnosis and treatment decisions. Available online and as an app. Access via an OpenAthens account.

BNF/BNFc Mobile App



Download the BNF app to your mobile device to access the latest BNF/BNFc prescribing information on the go.

Drug and Therapeutics Bulletin

Provides rigorous and independent evaluations of and practical advice on the treatment and management of disease for healthcare professionals.

e-Learning for Healthcare

Online e-learning training sessions featuring over 150 programmes developed by Health Education England in partnership with the NHS and professional bodies. Programmes cover subjects from audiology to anaesthesia, dentistry to dermatology, emergency medicine to end of life care, primary care to prescribing, safeguarding children to statutory and mandatory training.

Google Scholar and PubMed

NHS OpenAthens resources are now directly accessible through Google Scholar and PubMed. Once set up links to any OpenAthens resources will be displayed when searching in Google Scholar or PubMed. See the help pages on the Library website for set up instructions.

subject. A Cochrane systematic review will synthesise the results of any primary studies in the field that satisfy certain standards of scientific rigour and technique on the effectiveness of interventions and treatments into a single document.

To access the main library, computer rooms and to borrow books you will need your library card. This may be your Trust ID card or a Library Access card that we have given you. The barcode on this card is your Library ID number, you will need this to get a password for the University computers.

Outside of staffed hours you will not be able to access the Library without a valid card.
